A motion was made by Mr. Howson and seconded by Dr. Gilmore that a Weed Cutting Ordinance be drafted for 1949 charging \$4.00 per lot. Council agreed to waive rules; each councillor present polled and all voted aye. Solicitor was instructed to draft the ordinance.

Report made to Council by Wm. Thissen on collections and expenditures for the year 1948. Suggestion made that Barker's contract running one month into 1949 be adjusted so it terminates with end of year 1948.

It was requested that the Village Clerk call Jennings & Lawrence, North Third St. for two copies of original survey 1934 Van der Boe Hager Addition #11. No description of easement to sump pump.

Mr. Reams moved and Mr. Nairn seconded that an Ordinance for Ben Reaper for period from October 1, 1948 to December 31, 1948 and an Ordinance for O. J. Barker for the period from November 5, 1948 to December 31, 1948 be drawn up. Council waived rules and polled Individuals three times, voting "aye" for each ordinance.

Council waived second and third reading of Smoke Control and Dust Ordinance No. 42 and vote taken. Council members individually polled and all voted "aye" for ordinance.

Resolution that when curb is cut that there must be a concrete apron of six feet depth constructed as part of driveway, measured in from curb line and to be not less than eight inches thick. That building inspectors be instructed to impose this requirement as a condition to granting curb cutting. Resolution was unanimously adopted.
