REGULAR MEETING - March 18, 1949

Meeting called to order by Dr. Gilmore.

Present: Mayor Berkhermer, Councillors Dunn, Nairn, Ream, Howson, Guthrey and Thissen.

The mayor brought up the matter of door delivery of mail by the Worthington Post Office. It appears the Postmaster has taken no serious steps to improve the present inadequate service.

Mayor Berkhermer brought up the possibility that the village might devote some of its park space to playground use. The mayor appointed Ream, Guthrey and Howson as a committee to look into disposition of what the village should do in the matter of playgrounds.

The question of continuance of police protection for village by O. J. Barker was raised. Mr. Dunn moved, seconded by Mr. Guthrey that Ordinance No. 44 for employment of O. J. Barker for first three months of 1949 for \$40.00 per month. Vote taken and each councilman present individually voted in the affirmative.

Mr. Guthrey moved, seconded by Mr. Naim that Ordinance No. 45 for employment of Ben Reaper for first three months of 1949 for \$85.00 per month. Vote taken and each councilman present individually taken in affirmative.

Letter from Village solicitor, Mr. Dresbach in regard to request from Water Dept., City of Columbus, that we enter into an agreement in regard to sewage disposal and that an ordinance making city sewage charges shall be a lien on village property.

Ordinance #46 in regard to making the sewage and water charge a lien on Village land read by Dr. Gilmore. Mr. Ream moved and Mr. Dunn seconded that Ordinance #46 be passed. Moved that rules be suspended and read by title only. Each member of council polled individually three times; all voted "aye" each time.

Mr. Dunn moved that the job of Village policeman be abolished. Dr. Gilmore tabled motion for lack of second. Discussion ensued as to what alternative police protection could be provided. Mr. Howson offered to make report on method of clocking policing of village.




Report was then made by Building Commissioner Osborn, on the house plans of Mr. Born and Mr. Chakers stating they were acceptable.
