Mr. Guthery moved, Dr. Gilmore seconded that bills be paid. All councilmen voted "aye".

Ordinance #96 - Annual Budget was read by the Treasurer. It was moved by Dr. Gilmore, seconded by Mr. Dick that Ordinance #96 be adopted. All councilmen were polled individually and all voted "aye". Mr. Guthery moved and Mr. Landry seconded that the rules be suspended and Ordinance #96 be read twice by title only. The Clerk then read Ordinance #96 twice by title only, polling each Councilman individually after each reading and all voted "aye". The motion for adoption was made by Mr. Simpson and seconded by Mr. Landry. All councilmen voted "aye".

Ordinance #97 - Franklin County Civil Defence was read by the Clerk. Mr. Dick moved, Mr. Spees seconded that it be adopted. Mr. Spees moved and Dr. Gilmore seconded that the rules again be suspended and Ordinance #97 be read twice by title only. After each of two successive readings all councilmen voted "aye". Ordinance #97 was then declared adopted.

An Emergency Resolution relative to the Village objection to the Board of Tax Appeals was read by the Clerk. A Motion of adoption was made by Mr. Spees seconded by Mr. Dick. All councilmen voted "aye". A motion to suspend the rules and read the Resolution twice by title only was made by Dr. Gilmore and seconded by Mr. Guthery. After each of two successive readings the Council was polled individually and all voted "aye".

The Clerk was instructed to mail a copy of the Resolution to Town and City Officials and also Legislators of Franklin County. Approximately 150 were mailed or personally delivered.




There was a discussion relative to the proposed building for Lot #5 at the corner of Southington & High. No action taken.


The matter of the failure of Council to purchase the 438' easment along the north boundry of the Village when it was offered several years ago.


A motion to pay the bills was made by Mr. Simpson, seconded by Mr.
